Requirements and Procedures

By the morning of each class you must send me by email (gwp@hss.caltech.edu) a question on the reading. I will choose one of the questions for a short quiz, which will take place at the beginning of class.

You must write two papers, each approximately 2000 words long. The first is due October 30 at 1:30 p.m., and the second, December 11 at 5 p.m. One of your papers must be about Shake-speare's use of his sources in *Julius Caesar*, *Othello*, *Macbeth*, *Antony and Cleopatra*, *Coriolanus*, or *The Winter's Tale*: what do his omissions, additions, and modifications tell us about the play? The second paper will be on a topic of your own choosing. You must send me a short paragraph about your topic a week before the paper is due. Please send the papers to me as email attachments, preferably in Microsoft Word format; name the files with your surname and the number of the paper (e.g. smith1.doc). If you'd like me to read a draft of your paper before submitting it to be graded, I'll be happy to do so. I grant extensions but do not comment on late papers; I only grade them.

Two-thirds of your grade will be based on the papers, and the other third on the quizzes and class participation.
