Welcome to L102a. Please read over the following remarks which address various considerations concerning L102a.

If you have had no previous contact with the French language, it might be quite disconcerting at first to attend classes which will be conducted in French from the outset. Your textbook, lab manual, and instructor will attempt to create an environment in which you are forced to make sense of French and to communicate in French. Clearly your possibilities will be somewhat limited during the first few days. However, after your initial disorientation, you will find that you can interact in French in complex situations and that this ability will develop quite quickly. Regular practice (in class, and at home) is necessary and much more useful than intensive cramming prior to a quiz or exam. You must keep up with all assignments and come to class three times a week.
