Required Text

Ovid, *Ars amatoria: Book I*, ed. A. S. Hollis (Oxford University Press, 1989).

Requirements

We will read as much of *Ars amatoria I* as we can. The pace will be suited to your abilities; I expect you to spend two hours preparing for each one-hour class.

I recommend that you use the *Oxford Latin Dictionary*, which is in the reference collection in the Dabney reading room (PA2365.E5 O9 pts. 1–4 and 5–8). The next best dictionary is Lewis and Short's *Latin Dictionary*, a version of which is available as part of the Perseus Project: <http://www.perseus.tufts.edu/hopper/search> under "Dictionary Entry Lookup." Unfortunately, Perseus is often slow, so if you want to use Lewis and Short, you might consider downloading Diogenes (which requires perl): <http://sourceforge.net/projects/diogenes/files>.
