*Requirements*

The best dictionary is the *Oxford Latin Dictionary*, which is in the reference collection in the Dabney reading room (PA2365.E5 O9 pts. 1–4 and 5–8), but the next best—and most easily available—is Lewis and Short's *A Latin Dictionary* (<http://logeion.uchicago.edu/index.html>).

There will be a midterm and a final exam. The exams are closed book. 30% of your grade will be based on the midterm, 30% on the final, and 40% on class participation.
