L/VC111: Introduction to 21st-Century French Cinema

Course Description:

L/VC111 looks at popular genres (comedy, thriller, animation film) and auteur cinema. It focuses on major trends in contemporary French movies and their relationships to French society such as the exploration of class, ethnic, gender and sexual identity. It analyzes the reappropriation of the national heritage, the progressive feminization of the filmmaking profession and the new presence of directors who are immigrants or native born second generation. Throughout this course, students will further develop their understanding of the methods and concepts of cinema studies.

Classwork: Two films will be assigned every week. They all have English subtitles. Content and trigger warnings will be given for some movies and students will have the option to opt out of viewing and analysis without impact on their grades. The class will meet twice a week. The discussion will be in ENGLISH. Attendance and participation will be weighted heavily in determining the final grade. Students will have to write 3 papers in ENGLISH, five double spaced pages, typed each. Grades will be based on class participation (1/3) and papers (2/3). All assignments are to be prepared for the date on which they appear in the syllabus. Late assignments will be accepted only if prior permission has been granted, a 10% deduction will apply per day.
